

Professional Licensure Disclosures

Brewton-Parker Christian University offers certain academic programs that are designed to prepare students to pursue professional licensure or certification.

Professional licensure and certification requirements are established by individual state licensing authorities and may vary by state or territory. Completion of an academic program at Brewton-Parker Christian University does not guarantee licensure, certification, employment, or eligibility for a specific professional credential.

In accordance with applicable federal regulations and National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) policies, Brewton-Parker Christian University provides disclosures regarding whether its professional licensure programs satisfy the educational requirements for licensure in the State of Georgia and other U.S. states and territories.

Prospective and enrolled students who intend to seek professional licensure outside the State of Georgia are encouraged to contact the appropriate academic department before enrollment or prior to relocating during their program of study. The University will provide individualized professional licensure disclosures as required by applicable federal regulations and NC-SARA policy.

Professional Licensure Disclosure: Teacher Education

Brewton-Parker Christian University's educator preparation programs are approved by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC) and are designed to prepare candidates for initial teacher certification in the State of Georgia. The University has determined that these programs meet the educational requirements for initial teacher certification in Georgia.

At this time, Brewton-Parker Christian University has not determined whether its educator preparation programs meet the educational requirements for teacher licensure or certification in any other U.S. state or territory.

Completion of an educator preparation program does not guarantee teacher certification or licensure. Licensure is granted by the applicable state licensing authority upon satisfaction of all applicable requirements, which may include examinations, background checks, supervised clinical experiences, and other requirements established by state law.

Applicants who reside outside the State of Georgia should contact the School of Education before applying. The University will provide the appropriate professional licensure disclosure based upon the applicant's state of residence and applicable federal regulations and NC-SARA policy.

Students who relocate to another state while enrolled in the program should promptly notify the University, as a change in location may affect professional licensure disclosures and state authorization requirements.

Professional Licensure Disclosure: Nursing

Brewton-Parker Christian University's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program is approved by the Georgia Board of Nursing and accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). The program is designed to prepare graduates to pursue initial licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN). The University has determined that the program meets the educational requirements for initial RN licensure in the State of Georgia.

At this time, Brewton-Parker Christian University has not determined whether the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program meets the educational requirements for RN licensure in any other U.S. state or territory.

Completion of the BSN program does not guarantee licensure as a Registered Nurse. Licensure is granted by the applicable state board of nursing upon successful completion of the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) and satisfaction of all additional requirements established by the applicable licensing authority, which may include criminal background checks, fingerprinting, or other state-specific requirements.

Applicants who reside outside the State of Georgia should contact the School of Nursing before applying. The University will provide the appropriate professional licensure disclosure based upon the applicant's state of residence and applicable federal regulations and NC-SARA policy.

Students who relocate to another state while enrolled in the program should promptly notify the University, as a change in location may affect professional licensure disclosures and state authorization requirements.
